What is AP?



- AP = Advanced Placement
- College level curriculum and skills in the high school setting
- Classes culminate in the AP Exam, scored on a 1-5 scale
- Scores above 3 are considered "passing"; colleges vary on what credit they will award for each score

Benefits of AP

• College credit



 Rigorous coursework and advanced skill development

• Opportunity to grow knowledge base in desired field

What is Dual Enrollment ?

- These courses are taught by FCPS high school instructors who are NOVA adjunct professors and meet NOVA's credentialing requirements.**
- NOVA credit if a student passes the class with a C or higher.

• McLean HS offers 13 DE classes

**Geospatial Analysis - DE through JMU (not NOVA)

What are the benefits of DE?

- Exposure to college level coursework.
- NOVA/JMU credit if a student passes the class with a C or higher.
- Potential to earn college credits.
- Eliminate taking the same course in high school and college.
- Decrease the time required to finish a college degree, certificate, or industry credential.
- Lower postsecondary education costs.

- Our priority is to help your student choose the courses that will develop their skills and interests while not overwhelming them with too many AP classes.



In 2024....


- 1609 MHS students are • enrolled in at least one AP course, which represents 66% of the student body.

AP HISTORICAL DATA: STUDENTS WITH SCORES OF 3+






In 2024, 94% of McLean AP students earned at least one score of 3, 4 or 5 on AP exams.

MHS DUAL ENROLLMENT STATS - 2024

In 2024....

- 448 MHS students are enrolled in at least one DE course, which represents 18% of the student body.
- MHS currently running 11 DE courses. Our students are accessing an additional 9 DE courses through Chantilly Academy, Falls Church Academy, FCPS Online Campus, and Marshall Academy.
- Only high school juniors and seniors, who meet the established criteria, are eligible to participate in dual enrollment classes.

The Goldilocks Principle - just right

The "right" number of AP & DE classes varies per student, there is no magic number.

It is better to take one or two per year and earn higher marks than to overload and earn mediocre grades

Colleges want to see <u>consistency</u> in a student's schedule

Consistency does not mean taking all AP and DE courses; rather, taking consistent course levels within a content area.

If your student takes, enjoys and excels in an advanced Social Studies course as a Freshman, Sophomore and Junior, they should also take one Senior year (generally speaking).



It is important to select courses carefully

- The goal is for every student to start the year with a schedule that allows them to have balance.
- It is likely there will be very limited room next year when dropping courses.

Help your student pursue what interests them

- Continue talking to them about their current classes, what classes they want to take in the future, and why they want to take them
- Encourage conversations with teachers and school counselors
- Help them understand that they will be handling the course load, not their friends

FCPS AP Exam Policy

- Please keep in mind that the county-wide AP policy states FCPS will only pay for the first 6 AP exams for courses in which students are enrolled in for high school credit. This policy may factor into your student's course selection.
- The AP exam fee for the 2024-25 school year is \$99.00 per exam (for students who have exceeded the 6 exam limit). Families are billed for AP exams via MySchoolBucks.

FCPS DE Policy

- The registration deadline for Dual Enrollment courses is March 24th.
 - Academy class DE registration deadline is March 7th
- Courses taken at an FCPS high school are provided at no cost to the student (except for Geospatial Analysis).
- Concurrent courses (Independent Dual Enrollment) taken at a NOVA campus or through NOVA online require in-state tuition per NOVA's Tuition & Fees.

Dual Enrollment Registration

- To register for a DE class, students must first register/enroll at Northern Virginia Community College. Then they must register for the NOVA equivalent course. Instructions will be provided by your student's school counselor.
- DE Registration Sessions to assist students with registration will be held on the following dates. All sessions will be held in the Lecture Hall during HT FLEX.
 - Friday, January 31
 - Friday, March 7
 - Wednesday, March 19

Deadline to register through NOVA: March 24th (Academy registrations must be completed by March 7) *JMU Enrollment will occur during September for Geospatial Analysis There are a variety of documents available on the MHS Advanced Academics website designed to assist students in selecting the right courses for them.
