Review your <u>Junior</u> <u>Checklist</u>

Teacher Recommendation

- If you plan to apply to a 4 year college, you should have asked **one** teacher for their recommendation letter.
- Your main letter of recommendation should be written by a teacher of a core class: English, Social Studies, Math, Science, or a World Language.
- Ask in person.
- Be thankful for the letter. Teachers do not get paid for writing recommendation letters, and it takes a lot of time!
- Once you commit to a school next spring, let the teacher who wrote your letter of recommendation know where you are going. They want to hear back from you!

First Generation Students

Definition: a student whose parents did not complete a four-year college degree in the U.S.

Why?: Scholarships! Many scholarship opportunities for 2 and 4 year colleges.

Colleges like to recruit first generation students to provide tailored educational and career opportunities
