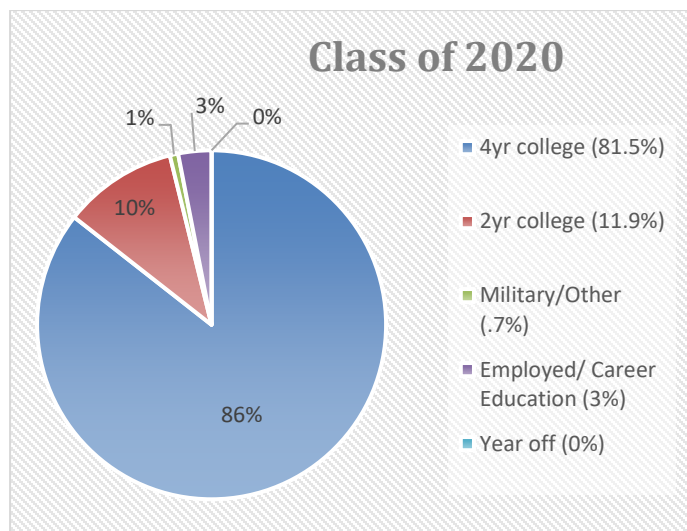

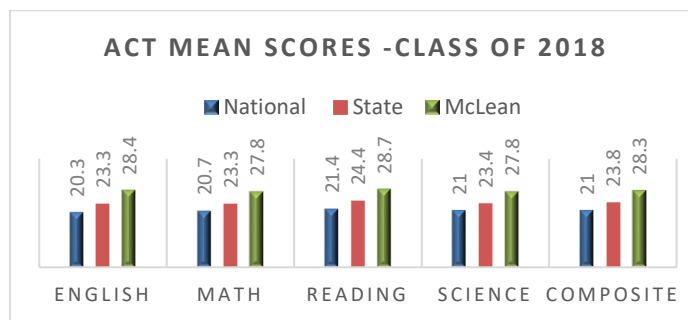
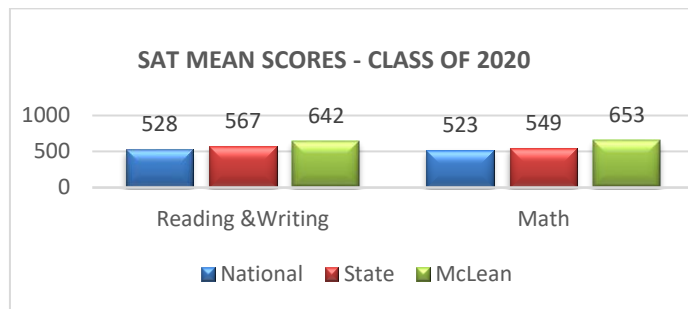

FCPS is the tenth largest school system in the nation with approximately 189,870 students attending 198 schools and centers. Twenty-nine percent of all students are projected to receive services for English learners (EL). Fourteen percent are projected to receive special education services.

Located in Fairfax County, Virginia, FCPS is the most populous jurisdiction in Virginia and the metropolitan Washington, D.C. area, with more than one million residents. McLean High School is located just four miles from Washington, D.C. and is home to a highly educated business and professional population.

Six high school academies offer technical and specialized courses not found at all high schools. Career and Technical Education (CTE), fine arts, and world languages courses are accessed by students from all high schools. CTE courses offer numerous credentialing opportunities for students who pass industry certification exams. Approximately 9% of MHS students attend one of these academies as part of their class day.

Grading System

Grade point average (GPA) is calculated on the basis of all high school courses for which credit has previously awarded. High School courses taken in middle school may be expunged from the high school transcript. The parent must submit a request within nine weeks of his/her child entering an FCPS high School.

COVID-19 Information

During the Spring 2020, FCPS school buildings were closed from March 13 to the end of the school year, and students were provided with both synchronous and asynchronous distance learning. Students were awarded final grades equivalent to their semester grade or one grade bump higher than their semester grade (B to a B+) based on their level of engagement and mastery of subject matter. FCPS has opened schools virtually for the 2020-21 School Year. Students receive virtual instruction 5 days per week, including 4 days of live, face-to-face online instruction with teachers and one day of independent, asynchronous learning. Each class is 80 minutes in length. Student attendance is required and all students will receive assignments that will be graded.
